The Hearing is part of the Coalition of Immokalee Workers' Taco Bell Truth Tour.

The Board includes a former State legislator, a former Congressman and representatives from the Jefferson County Teacher's Association, Catholic Conference of KY, Rubbertown Emergency Action Network, Democracy Resource Center, Eastern Star Baptist Church and Metropolitan Housing Coalition.
